Calculating an admission average

In order to study some university-level courses, students are required to have completed certain high school classes. For example:

- To study university-level biology, chemistry or physics, the Grade 12 (senior-level) course of the same subject is required.
- To study university-level calculus, Grade 12 (senior-level) pre-calculus or a university-level pre-calculus class is required.

Manitoba transcripts

After applying for admission, applicants should upload a copy of their transcript to the admission portal. After graduating, students must request a Manitoba High School Marks Statement to be sent directly to USask via postal mail by Manitoba Education. Final grades for all subjects are needed to ensure admission conditions are met. If not received by August 1, it may impact students' admission and ability to enroll.
