



Certificate in Dental Assisting Admissions Information Guide Fall 2027

APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 15, 2027

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

The College of Dentistry at the University of Saskatchewan offers a 10-month Certificate in Dental Assisting. This document provides information for applicants seeking admission for the Fall 2027 intake.

The Dental Assisting program focuses on patient-centered care in support of improving oral health as a key to personal health and wellbeing. As vital members of the dental health team, dental assistants work in private dental clinics, specialists' offices and community health centers. Skills and content covered include clinic operations, chair-side procedures, intra-oral procedures, patient education and interpersonal skills.

Students are required to attend classes on the U of S campus for this program. Classroom learning is integrated into a dental clinic setting. The clinical components include patient education, radiographs and selective rubber cup polishing and fluoride application.

II. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A. Academic Requirements

Completion of the following courses or equivalents with an overall average of **at least 65%**:

- Foundations of Mathematic 30 or Pre-Calculus 30
- English Language Arts A30 or English Language Arts B30
- Biology 30,
- Chemistry 30
- One elective from social sciences, natural sciences, humanities or fine or performing arts at the 30-level

For applicants who:

- are currently enrolled in high school, marks for Grade 11-level subjects may be used as predictors for performance in Grade 12-level subjects if an appropriate Grade 12-level subject has not already been completed.
- are internationally educated, we'll convert your marks to correspond with Canadian grading systems.
- have completed high school, only marks for senior-level (Grade 12) subject will be used.

B. Proof of Residency

All applicants are required to submit proof of residency, either as a Saskatchewan applicant or an out-of-province applicant. Acceptable documentation must be received by the March 1 document deadline. For detailed information on residency categories and a list of acceptable proof, please refer to Section III: Categories of Applicants.

C. Interview

All eligible applicants seeking admission are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process. Interviews are granted based on the academic average.

D. English Language Proficiency

All applicants must demonstrate English Language Proficiency prior to admission, including students educated in Canada.

The language of instruction at the University of Saskatchewan is English. Applicants whose primary language is not English must present evidence of proficiency in English per the University of Saskatchewan acceptable levels of academic English. E. Criminal Record Check

Self-declaration of an adult criminal record is required of all applicants on the application form. Applicants accepted into the program are required to complete and submit a Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening *after* the date of offer and no later than **August 23**. There are currently some Canadian provinces that will not register a dental assistant to practice if they have a criminal record. Applicants are encouraged to contact the respective provincial Dental Assistant's Association for further information.

F. Immunization Requirements

Successful applicants must comply with the University of Saskatchewan's policy on immunization, which states that all students attending a Health Science College must provide documented proof of immunization. Immunization records for accepted applicants must be received by the date stated in the letter of offer.

III. CATEGORIES OF APPLICANTS

The College of Dentistry admits 50 students to the program each year. Applicants must designate their category on the online application form. All applicants must be Canadian citizens or landed immigrants at the time of application.

A. Saskatchewan Residents

To be eligible as a Saskatchewan resident, applicants must have resided in Saskatchewan for at least FOUR years immediately prior to September 1 of the year admission is being sought. For Fall 2027 intake, applicants must have resided in Saskatchewan since **September 1, 2023**. Applicants who have left the province but previously lived in Saskatchewan for an accumulated period of 15 years (permanent residency), will be considered residents. Applicants who have previously lived in Saskatchewan for an accumulated period of less than 15 years and who do not qualify

under the four-year requirement will receive credit of one year toward the four-year requirement for every four years of residency in the province. **There are NO EXCEPTIONS to the four-year Saskatchewan residency rule.**

In order to support a claim as a resident of Saskatchewan, the following proof and circumstances will be taken into account:

- **Date of issue** of your Saskatchewan Health Card¹ **AND** either the date of issue of your Saskatchewan Drivers' License² **OR** Saskatchewan Income Tax Forms confirming taxes paid in Saskatchewan
- Applicants who have completed four years of full-time study at a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution immediately prior to the year admission is being sought are considered Saskatchewan residents. Official transcripts must be submitted by the document deadline to support this claim
- Reasons for any break in continuity of residence, which includes attendance at an out-of-province educational institution, summer employment where applicable and any other reason deemed to be relevant
- Saskatchewan high school transcript (if you are NOT currently registered at the University of Saskatchewan) or
- Resident of the Yukon or Northwest Territories or Nunavut.

¹ If the date of issue of your Saskatchewan Health Card is newer than the original date of issue, a letter from Saskatchewan Health confirming the date of issue is required.

² If the date of issue of your Saskatchewan Drivers' License is newer than the original date of issue, a Drivers Abstract is required.

B. Canadian Out of Province Applicants

Applicants are required to complete course equivalents to those listed in Section II A. Equivalent course work will be evaluated based upon submission of official transcripts.

Applicants must be citizens of Canada or have permanent residency status (landed immigrant) on the date of application. 20% of the overall seats will be designated for Canadian out of province applicants.

To be eligible as an out of province resident, applicants must have resided outside of Saskatchewan for at least TWO years immediately prior to September 1 of the year admission is sought. For 2027-2028, applicants must have resided outside of Saskatchewan since September 1, 2025. Applicants who have relocated from their home province, territory, or country to Saskatchewan will be considered out-of-province residents if the four-year Saskatchewan residency requirement has not been met.

In order to support a claim as an out of province resident, the following proof and circumstances will be taken into account:

- Date of issue of your provincial Health Card¹
- Date of issue of your provincial Drivers' License²
- Out of province Income Tax Forms confirming taxes paid outside of Saskatchewan
- Applicants who have completed two years of full-time study at a post-secondary institution outside of Saskatchewan immediately prior to the year admission is being sought are considered out of province residents.

Official transcripts must be submitted by the document deadline to support this claim

- Out of province high school transcript
- Household/Utility Statements or Lease Agreements
- Immigration documents

C. Indigenous Equity Access Program

There is a separate category in which 17% of first-year spaces are reserved for persons of Canadian Indigenous Ancestry. Applicants must meet the minimum admission requirements.

Applicants wishing to apply in this category must identify themselves on the online application form. Applicants must provide proof of Indigenous Ancestry by the document deadline.

Applicants self-identify as Indigenous on the application form and submit government documentation and/or other documentation in support of that claim as determined by the Office of the Vice-Provost Indigenous Engagement. Applicants will be evaluated on all of the above criteria. Admission under the Indigenous equity access category is **NOT** guaranteed.

IV. SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection for admission to the Dental Assisting program is based on the following:

1. **Academic Average (50% overall weighting)**
2. **Interview (50% overall weighting)**

V. PRACTICUM REQUIREMENTS

In compliance with the practice agreements with our clinical partners, successful candidates will be requested to provide proof of the following requirements:

- Current Heart and Stroke Foundation Health Care Provider Level (C) CPR
- Updated Immunization Records
- Security Clearance
- Health and Wellness Status

VI. APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. How to Apply for Admission

The College of Dentistry accepts online applications only. The online application is available **September 25, 2026 – February 15, 2027**. The online application can be accessed on the following website:

1. When accessing the application for the first time, click 'Create account' to set up an account.
2. Once an account has been created, login using the email and password to access the application.
3. Ensure that you meet all of the admission requirements listed.
4. Review the Eligibility Requirements to understand the process and deadlines.
5. Apply to the Dental Assisting program and submit your transcripts.

6. Log into <https://apply.usask.ca> to check your admission status.
7. Continue to monitor changes to your application status.

A non-refundable application fee in the amount of **\$108 CDN** is required and **MUST** be paid online via credit card at the time the application is submitted. The application fee may be paid by Visa, MasterCard or Discover.

VII. REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

Please refer directly to specific policies when confirming required documentation.

If you are attending or have graduated from a Saskatchewan high school:

Request official transcripts to be sent directly to the University of Saskatchewan by the Ministry of Education as soon as possible, and if you are currently registered in classes, after June exams 2027.

If you have graduated from an International or out of province high school:

After you have applied, upload a copy of your most up-to-date transcript. For students currently attending high school, the transcript will need to include semester 1 final grades. Arrange to have your final, official transcript of marks sent directly to the University of Saskatchewan via postal mail or courier by the appropriate authority, such as your school, school board or governmental organization.

If you have taken classes in college or university:

Upload a copy of your most recent transcript showing marks for all the classes you've completed and listing classes still in progress. Arrange to have final, official transcript(s) mailed or couriered directly to the University of Saskatchewan by the institution(s) you attended.

All of the following must be received **no later than February 15**:

- Completed online application with payment of \$108 CDN application fee

All of the following required documentation must be received **no later than March 1**:

- Official transcripts or Final Grade 12 Term 1 High School transcript from **all** high school and post-secondary institutions attended other than the University of Saskatchewan (including distance education classes).
 - A conditional offer of admission may be granted based on your Grade 12 Term 1 Transcript from your school that you are expected to meet program admission requirements. A final official transcript must be requested by **August 1, 2027**.
- If applicable, the following supporting documents:
 - High School Timetable
 - Proof of Residency
 - Proof of Aboriginal ancestry
 - Proof of English proficiency

VIII. NOTIFICATION OF APPLICATION STATUS

Applicants will be informed by email, of their application status in May. To accept an offer of admission, applicants must pay a non-refundable deposit of 15% of tuition by the deadline stated in the offer letter. The deposit will be applied towards tuition fees at the time of registration. Applicants who withdraw their admission acceptance after paying the fee forfeit the deposit.

If offered admission, applicants are required to submit the following documentation:

- Final Official transcripts for courses taken during the 2026-2027 year are **due no later than August 1**.

All offers of admission are conditional upon the successful applicant achieving/maintaining:

- Completion of the required courses or equivalents with an overall average of **at least 65%**.
- Successful completion of your high school graduation requirements and achieve Grade 12 standing.

- Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening **due no later than August 23**.

The Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector Screening must be completed **AFTER** the date of the offer of admission.

IX. COUNSELLING OF APPLICANTS TO THE CERTIFICATE IN DENTAL ASSISTING PROGRAM

Admissions staff in the office of Student Services is available to assist all applicants who seek counsel regarding admission to the Certificate in Dental Assisting program. However, it is the College's policy not to instruct applicants as to a specific course of action they should follow, but rather provide the information needed for applicants to make their own choices with respect to the alternatives available.

X. ADMISSION & APPLICATION STATISTICS

For the 2026-2027 academic year, the mean academic averages of applicants admitted to the program were:

XIV. IMPORTANT NOTES

Final official transcripts sent **DIRECTLY** from **all** high school and post-secondary institutions attended, including distance education courses, are required. All transcripts and other official documents become the property of the University of Saskatchewan and will not be returned.

Applicants seeking admission on the basis of official documents that are in a language other than English must submit notarized copies of their original documents attached to notarized, word for word, English translations.

All correspondence will be via email. Please ensure your email address is current and that your email account will accept email from the University of Saskatchewan (add the @usask.ca domain to your safe list).

Applications are not complete until **ALL** required documents are received. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all required documentation is received. Applicants can check the status of their application online by logging in to their application.
